

Capital Farm Credit's Community Outreach Grant Program provides grants to Texas FFA chapters and 4-H clubs to assist them in bringing positive change by establishing projects that make local communities better places to live. Grants range from \$500-\$1000; dependent on the proposed budget of the chapter.

Examples of community outreach projects include, but are not limited to: constructing a welcome sign for a community, organizing a cleanup day at, or improving, local fairgrounds or parks, or developing a community garden.

Deadline for 2018 applications is March 1, 2018.

Each proposal will be reviewed and scored by a grant review team. Applicants will be notified no later than April 1, 2018 if they've been awarded a grant.
